At the Cahaba Biodiversity Center, visitors have on previous trips:

- -Tested water quality at various streams.
- Provided headlamps when delving into a cave.
- Traveled to the Cahaba River to use dipnets, bathyscopes, and walking seines to view snakes, salamanders, fish, and other creatures.



- Traveled to a spring to view other creatures to view life there.
- Traveled the dendrology trail to discuss trees, and whichever plantlife that happens to be blooming.
- Discussed the geology of the property, fossils buried within the limestone of a dry creekbed, etc.
- Spent time at the pavillion, viewing small creatures underneath a microscope.

The Cahaba Biodiversity Center has a variety of facilities which can accomodate groups of people. With serene forests just outside and convenient lodging for visitors of all stripes, the activites available are sure to be fulfilling and educational.
